COMPANY BACKGROUND

Denel SOC Ltd is a state-owned listed as a Schedule 2 public entity that operates and accounts for its activities in accordance with the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) Act No 1 of 1999 as amended.

The Denel Group of companies have a combined experience spanning more than 200 years with its core capabilities dating 70 years back when its first manufacturing plants were established.

Denel's solutions are designed to meet unique user requirements and provide full lifecycle support. Its products and capabilities include combat turrets, artillery and vehicle systems, missiles, command and control, maintenance, repair and overhaul of aircraft (MRO), avionics upgrades, testing of airborne systems, munitions as well as humanitarian services, including demining.

The company's core operating divisions are predominantly clustered in various locations around the Gauteng Province, the economic hub of the country, as well as in the Western Cape Province. These divisions include:

- Denel Dynamics, which manufactures missiles, guided weapons, Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) and Space technology. It is also responsible for the SA Army's Ground Based Air Defence System (GBADS) and house command and control capabilities.
- Denel Pretoria Metal Pressings (Denel PMP) in Pretoria West manufactures small and medium caliber ammunition, brass products, detonics, power cartridges and mining drill bits.
- Denel Land Systems (DLS) a systems integrator manufactures and supports land systems combat equipment. DLS incorporates Denel Mechem which specialises in explosive remnants of war clearance solutions, canine solutions, ballistic /mine protected vehicles and field facilities services.
- Denel Aeronautics the leading aerospace company in Africa and a powerhouse in design and MRO solutions to the military and commercial sectors on the continent incorporating Denel Technical Academy which provides Aviation and Engineering Training across all disciplines for the past 50-years.



 Denel Vehicle Systems incorporates 3 business units - OMC, Gear Ratio and Mechatronics. OMC is a manufacturer of armoured vehicles and provides maintenance, upgrades and retrofits of military vehicles. Gear Ratio manufactures components for transmissions and drivelines. Mechatronics designs and manufactures weapons systems, surveillance equipment, as well as sighting and fire control systems.

The Denel Group further boasts a world-class testing facility, Denel Overberg Test Range, located in the scenic Overberg region of the Western Cape. Supporting all these divisions is the Denel Corporate Office (Headquarters) and Denel Properties in Irene, Centurion.

1. SERVICE DESCRIPTION (Salary Survey)

The HR Department requires an On-line market salary survey web-based system with real-time functionality for 4 users for a minimum 12 months period. This is an ongoing requirement.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE REQUIRED SERVICES

As per the Employment Equity Act, it is a requirement for Denel to ensure the fair remuneration across the employment categories for work done. To enable Denel to comply, they need to be enabled with a system that has access to market salary data.

As part of the Turn Around plan, Denel has embarked upon a centralised approach for the management of remuneration and requires a tool to benchmark internal salaries with the external market to ensure fair remuneration practices.

3. SCOPE OF WORK (Salary Survey)

The purpose of this RFT is to obtain proposals from suitably qualified and experienced salary survey companies that can offer a web-based system with real-time functionality and data available for general staff levels and executive levels in the Private Sector as well as State Owned Enterprises.

Denel is looking to for a web-based system that can:



- provide accurate market-related grades (including modal grades) that is fully integrated with the Organised Framework for Occupations (OFO) reporting standard;
- provide analytical capabilities to view the Company's data in comparison to the market;
- reflect comprehensive information on the remuneration elements per position and across all levels in the organisation;
- filter by the jobs that exist in your company, or access the full database of jobs;
- provide salary information for positions in Paterson grades.

During this phase Bidders' responses will be evaluated based on compliance with the listed expectations and criteria as in Clause 9:

- Reputable and highly experienced specialist in remuneration with national and international capability
- Salary survey data must be audited and proof of a clean audit for the last 5 years.

Only those Tenderers which score **70 points or higher (out of a possible 100)** during the technical and site visit evaluation will be evaluated during the second stage of the Tender. Tenderers are required to submit supporting documentation as testimony to their compliance with each requirement, where applicable.



SBD 9 CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between



parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.

- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
